The purpose of this budget amendment memo is to provide an update on Build Kansas Fund (BKF) Application 2024-027-MARC from the City of Edgerton. This amendment pertains to the federal request amount (funding unlocked), and commitment of a local match. The original BKF request remains the same.

## **Project Overview**

On September 5, 2024, the US Department of Transportation announced 354 fiscal year (FY) 2024 Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant awards totaling over \$1 billion to local, regional, and Tribal communities. Kansas received one (1) award this round (round 2) and six (6) in round 1. The City of Edgerton was awarded \$220,000 in funding from the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) for the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program to develop a comprehensive safety action plan, conduct a safety audit of an intersection, and conduct follow-up stakeholder engagement and collaboration.

The City originally applied for Build Kansas Funds in the amount of \$45,000 and was approved by the Steering Committee on April 17, 2024, and the Build Kansas Advisory Committee on April 29, 2024. Rather than submit their SS4A application during round 1 as planned, Edgerton submitted their application during the round 2 program cycle. Between the time they received notice of commitment of BKF and the round 2 deadline, the City decided to include demonstration activities in the project scope, which increased their federal request and total project cost. As a result, the City committed \$10k of local and in-kind contributions to meet the federal match requirement of 20%. The federal funding applied for increased from \$180,000 to \$220,000. The BKF request remains \$45,000.
