



BIL Overview


- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
 - AKA Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)
- National Infrastructure Investment = \$1.2 Trillion across 5 years
 - Nearly 400 programs across 12 Federal Agencies
 - 60% Formula / 40% Discretionary





Build Kansas Fund | STO Reimbursement Process

*Note – this process begins after the BKF Application is approved by Steering Committee and Advisory Committee



Key Assumptions: Federal program is reimbursement based; BKF will be distributed after federal reimbursement is made and appropriate documentation is provided; Oversight and compliance is performed by federal funding agency and expected to satisfy BKF needs; Distribution of funds will occur in a cadence defined by federal award.




Access Build Kansas Funds

Important notes


- The Hub is <u>not</u> selecting projects
 - The Hub serves in an advisory capacity
- Projects only receive Build Kansas Funds <u>if awarded</u> a federal grant
 - Federal agencies make project selections and provide award notification
- This is additive only
 - Communities can apply without requesting Technical Assistance OR making a Build Kansas Fund Application

Kansas Grant Wins through BKF

Southwest Kansas Groundwater Management District #3

Awarded a WaterSMART Water and Energy Efficiency Grant in the amount of \$500,000. The project will improve water use efficiency and eliminate infiltration and evaporation losses in the main stem of the South Side Ditch system. The GMD did receive TA from the Hub and will receive \$500,000 through BKF.

City of Ellsworth

Awarded an Airport Infrastructure Grant (AIG) in the amount of \$117,429. This project is for a snow removal equipment building. The City did receive TA from Hub and will receive \$13,048 through BKF.)



July 16 BKFAC Application Follow up

- City of Topeka (2024-055-NoEDD)
 - BKFAC contingently approved if the City contributed 5% of the nonfederal match requirement
 - The City has since modified their request to include a contribution of \$157,079.10 making their BKF request \$2,984,502.90
- City of Coffeyville (2024-060-SEKRPC)
 - BKFAC contingently approved if the City contributed 5% of the nonfederal match requirement
 - The City has since modified their request to include a contribution of \$23,500.00 making their BKF request \$446,500.00



Ineligible Applications

- City of McPherson (South Central Region)
 - Application was received July 25, 2024
 - Applicant was applying for the Transportation Alternatives Program
 - Transportation Alternatives Due Date was May 17, 2024.
 - This application was submitted AFTER the federal deadline and therefore, ineligible.
- City of Washington (North Central Region)
 - Application was received July 31, 2024
 - Applicant is applying for the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program
 - Determined it did not have a match requirement.



Applicant Cost Share Expectation

- ✓ Eligible applicants are expected to contribute a portion of the non-Federal match requirement.
- ✓ This contribution can be in the form of cash and/or in-kind contributions.
- ✓ The goal is to demonstrate the applicant's commitment to the project.
- ✓ The contribution should be significant. For a local public entity, 5% of the non-federal match is a good guideline, but not a requirement.




Applicant Cost Share Expectation – Exclusions and Justifications

- ✓ Eligible applicants who cannot meet the cost share expectation can provide detailed written justifications.
- ✓ Exceptions or exclusions from the cost share expectations may be granted based on valid reasons.
- ✓ Collaborative applications or regional projects may also be considered for exclusion on a case-by-case basis.
